The Beginnings of Linda Glover Christian Foundation Home and School



Founded in 2007 in Monrovia, Liberia on a fouracre campus to share the love and hope of Jesus with children without parents, the LGCF Home and School started as a single campus providing for the housing, family, spiritual, and education needs. These first children have grown into young adults, graduating from high school, and going on to college or trade school. The Tower Hill campus houses 25 children and along with two other school campus educates more than a thousand enrolled students. Our prayer is that the Lord will guide the vision and

action of the leaders of LGCF to create a loving environment where the children there will receive a home, an education, but most importantly an introduction to Christ.

1989 Glovers lived in Liberia and when the war started in December 1989, they returned to the U.S.

1991 John went to the Liberian refugee camp in Ghana. He found some of his former students from Liberia Bible College. They had started a church. Two government ministers of health and welfare met with John and Accepted food, medicine, and supplies for the refugee camp.

1991-2006 There was no contact with the Liberian Christians. Many of them died by bombings, murder, starvation, no health care, and diseases. Many were displaced to other countries.

2007 Glovers returned to post-war

Liberia. There were many events and stories. God brought together a special reunion with some of our former students. A friend of the Glovers had visited Liberia in the early post-war time. He asked John to visit the West Point Area. John agreed because we had done ministry there in 1989. In October of 2007, the leaders of the West Point School contacted the Glovers and wanted to name the school the Linda Glover School. They said

they remembered our ministry in West Point and

2008 John signed to purchase four acres for the Linda Glover Christian Foundation Tower Hill Campus.

2011-2021 Through the years the home and school grew, adding facilities, programs, and the West Point school campus.

2021 A new house is built for the girls at Tower Hill, and a third LGCF school campus is added on Bushrod Island named Popo Beach, Point 4.

2022 There are a total of 1100 students enrolled in LGCF school across all three campuses.





Here are some amazing things about these schools: students on all three campuses are encouraged to be leaders in the community; Bible classes are a part of the curriculum; students have P.E. and sports activity daily; and the schools have an excellent record on passing the government required academic tests. All teachers attend continuing education classes, and some are enrolled in higher education programs. Additionally, the Tower Hill campus features a newly

constructed science lab.

There are no words to express how God has brought people together

stateside and in Liberia for a purpose to care for these children. This purpose will outlive us all and go into eternity.
